
# **OPERATIONS**

# The Nelson Police Department would like to share a list of tips for a fun and safe Halloween:

- Trick or Treaters should only go up to well-lit houses and remain on the porch rather than entering the home.
- Travel in small groups (ideally with an adult)
- Ensure trick-or-treaters know their phone number

## When walking in neighborhoods, kids should:

- Use flashlights, stay on sidewalks and avoid crossing through yards.
- Cross streets at the corner and DO NOT cross between parked cars
- Wear a light-coloured or bright costume, use reflective tape or arm bands to increase visibility.
- Consider using face paint instead of masks (as masks can obstruct vision.)

#### Parents and adults should:



- Establish a return-time for older children.
- Prepare your home for trick-or-treaters by clearing your porch, sidewalk and lawns.
- Drive slowly and be very aware of children who may be darting across streets or from between parked cars.

#### **Home Heating Safety**

With the onset of fall weather, Nelson Fire Rescue would like to remind residents to check and service their seasonal heating equipment. This time of year typically sees an increased number of fires from poorly maintained wood, gas, and electrical appliances. Things to pay attention to include: seasonal maintenance by certified

technicians, cleaned chimneys and flues, appropriate clearances of combustibles and proper air supply.

With any appliance burning either wood, or natural gas, proper maintenance is imperative to avoid the hazards of carbon monoxide (CO). Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless gas that can have severe, and even deadly consequences beginning in concentrations as low as 35 parts per million. If you suspect CO exposure and experience headache, nausea, disorientation, unconsciousness, and/or flu like symptoms, seek fresh air and call 911 immediately.

#### BE SAFE AND BE SEEN WHILE WAITING FOR A BUS

Shorter days and poor weather conditions can make it more difficult for pedestrians to be seen by motorists and bus drivers, especially along un-lit rural roads. Nelson Transit would like to offer the following advice when taking public transit to ensure a safe trip:

- **Get noticed!** Wear bright clothes and reflective gear, especially in low light or poor weather. Waving a flashlight as the bus approaches is very helpful, after dark, in rural areas. Don't be left stranded.
- Familiarize yourself with bus schedules and make note of key times such as the last trip of the night.
- If possible, wait for the bus in a well-lit area.
- Stay alert and avoid distractions, such as the use of electronic devices while walking.
