WATER CONSERVATION IN NELSON

The City of Nelson has joined with Columbia Basin Trust again this summer for their Water Smart Initiative program. The City has hired Avery Deboer-Smith as our 2016 Water Smart Ambassador. Avery will be out in the community for the duration of the summer in an educational role and providing free lawn and garden assessments for Nelson residents. Avery will assess your soil type and your watering system and provide you with a recommended watering schedule based on a variety of factors. *This year, all residents who complete an assessment will receive a free hose-timer and be entered to win a prize of a low-flow toilet or a rain barrel.*

You can also pick up your free Toilet Tank Bag at City Hall to help reduce the amount of water going down the drain.



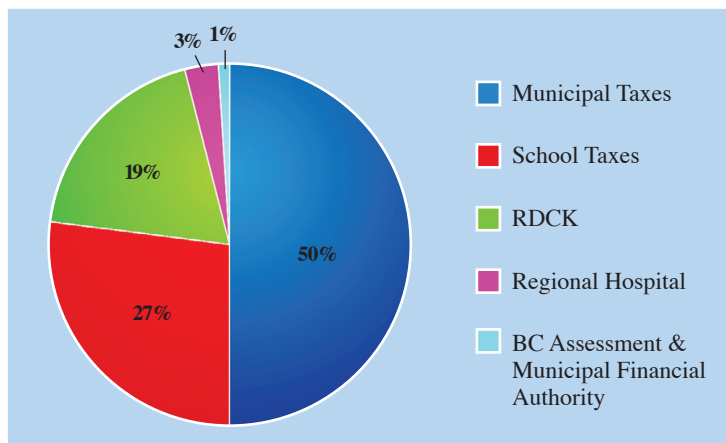

PROPERTY TAX NOTICES

2016 Property Tax Notices have been mailed out. Taxes are due on July 4, 2016, after which time a penalty of 10% will apply on any outstanding balance due. If you are eligible for the Home Owner Grant, that must also be claimed by the due date to avoid late penalty charges on the grant amount. If you have still not received your Property Tax Notice by the end of the month, please contact City Hall at 250-352-8248. Be sure to check the insert with your Property Tax Notice for details on how to pay, and how to claim your Home Owner Grant online, or visit www.nelson.ca.

OPERATIONS

ALLEY OBSTRUCTIONS

There has been an increase in the number of structures and materials encroaching on City lanes and alleys. These include composters, garbage containers, retaining walls, fences, overgrown shrubs, trees, and yard waste. In addition, our City crews have noted improperly parked vehicles, trailers and boats in the laneways which can create difficult and unsafe passage for City garbage trucks, hydro line trucks, fire trucks, ambulance emergency service vehicles and residential traffic.

What can you do to help?

- Place garbage containers, composters and materials onto private property.
- Remove structures/materials encroaching on City property.
- Trim overhanging trees and shrubs.
- Dispose of combustible materials, including dry leaves, yard and tree clippings.
- Do not park vehicles, trailers or boats in the alley as to obstruct through traffic.
