NELSON HYDRO CUSTOMER SERVICE METER INSPECTION

This spring, Nelson Hydro will begin an inspection of all customer metered services within our service territory. The purpose of this inspection is to review the condition of existing electrical services and to advise the home owners of any need to improve their service for safety or reliability reasons. You may notice Hydro staff visiting your property and taking photos of the overhead service conductor, the service on your building and the meter itself.



Some examples of concerns that may be identified:

- Brushing of service conductors required
- Bent, loose or detached service mast
- Inaccessible meters

When needed, a follow up letter will be sent advising property owners of the specific concerns. If brushing is required, instructions will be provided for having your line de-energized so the work can be done safely. In cases where the service is dated, but does not yet appear to be a safety concern, you will be advised that Nelson Hydro recommends inspection of your service by a qualified electrical contractor.

If a service appears to pose an immediate safety concern, Nelson Hydro may perform an internal inspection of components in the meter base. If an immediate safety concern is confirmed, Technical Safety BC will be informed and the service may be disconnected until it has been made safe and a permit from a qualified electrical contractor confirms the service is ready to be reconnected.

EMERGENCY WATER INTAKE

Phase 1 of the construction of the City's emergency water intake, located near the west-end of the lakeside dog-walk, has begun. Expected completion is the end of March or early April. This intake will allow water to be drawn from Kootenay Lake to a temporary and modular satellite treatment system, which can provide drinking water for the lower part of the city. The system is only intended to be operational during severe drought or other emergency events.

During construction, access to the dog-walk will be restricted. There will be no access to the dog-walk from the parking lot located at the end of Lakeside Drive. Pedestrian access is still permitted from the trail entrance near the Prestige Resort, however, trail users will have to turn around approximately two-thirds of the way down the trail. We appreciate your patience while we complete this important project.

Due to construction taking place in the parking lot at the foot of Hall Street, the dog walk trail access may be restricted for short periods of time for safety reasons.

STREET CLEANING

City crews have begun street cleaning and are out sweeping streets and removing winter sand. Please remember to follow the odd/even parking rule within residential areas, by parking your vehicle on the odd-numbered side of the street on odd-numbered dates, and the even-numbered side of the street on even-numbered dates. Please note, vehicles that do not follow the odd/even rule may be towed.

If your home is adjacent to a boulevard, please rake the sand onto the street beside the curb. **A big thank you to all residents who do this year after year!**



SCHEDULE FOR STREET CLEANING

City crews start at the lower elevations and work their way up hill.

1. Fairview
2. Downtown, Gyro Park area, View Street area, lower Uphill
3. Upper Uphill and Rosemont

CARBON MONOXIDE

Q. What is silent, deadly, and tasteless? A. Carbon Monoxide or C.O.

You cannot tell if C.O is present until it has a negative effect on you (which MAY include headaches, dizziness, weakness, vomiting, or confusion) - it makes sense to have a C.O. detector in your home. And if you already have one, check the age of the unit. If it is out of date (5-10 years old, depending on the manufacturer) you can recycle it, along with old smoke alarms, at Home Hardware Building Centre - 101 MacDonald Drive.

Remember, this easily-absorbed gas is lethal and undetectable by humans. If you feel you have been exposed to it, move to fresh air and call 911.
