DEVELOPMENT SERVICES

Have you ever wondered 'why' you need a building permit? The Department of Development Services would like to share with you why Council has a Building Permit process in place.

- The Building Code, Zoning bylaw and Building Bylaw are designed to help ensure that properties are safe for occupants and the community as a whole. This means structural integrity, safety from environmental and fire hazards, and air quality.
- A Building Permit allows for an independent review by a third party for the homeowner to help ensure that work is being done correctly. Infractions can be dangerous to live with, costly to fix, and result in legal ramifications or charges on your title.
- Insurance companies are interested because they know that a well-built house means less claims, and they may not cover claims that arise as a result of either faulty or illegal construction.
- Energy consumption affects us all, and the Building Code sets minimum standards that will reduce energy costs to a homeowner and to our environment.
- Thinking of selling? Future legal transactions of the property (e.g. mortgage renewal, selling, etc.) may be significantly impacted by 'illegal' construction work.

OPERATIONS

WATER MAIN FLUSHING PROGRAM

Water mains are flushed annually in the spring to remove pipe sediment and for water quality. During flushing, water pressure may reduce and/or the water may be discoloured. This will be remedied by turning on a cold water tap and letting it run a few minutes until it clears.

SPRING RUNOFF

With spring runoff underway, the City reminds residents to use common sense around rising creeks and drain courses. Please monitor children playing by fast-flowing waterways. Please report blockages due to branches and other debris to the Operations Department at (250)352-8238.

Trees and Vegetation Around Power Lines

Nelson Hydro crews will be pruning tree branches that are too close to a utility line for the following reasons: public safety, reducing tree-related power outages and to meet industry standards that require a clearing of 5 meters from 60,000 volt lines, 3 meters from 25,000 volt lines and 1 meter from 750 volt (or less) lines and communication lines (telephone and cable). Where practical, residents will be notified when tree pruning is planned for a neighbourhood. For more information, call 250-352-8240.

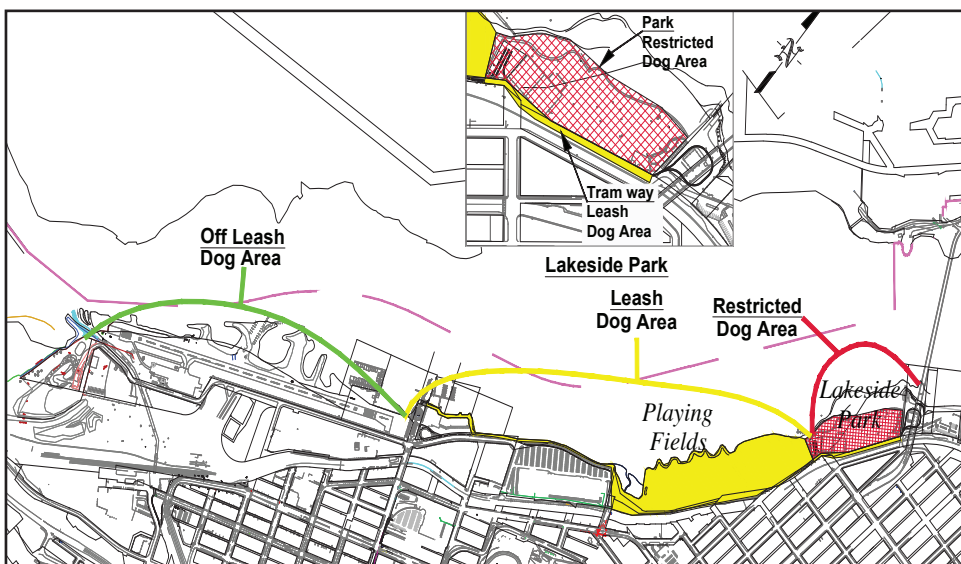

NELSON POLICE DEPARTMENT

Enjoying the great outdoors!

With the beautiful weather we have had recently and with summer fast approaching, the Nelson Police Department would like to remind all park users of the following rules so that our parks can be enjoyed by all.

- Consuming liquor, or possessing open containers of liquor is a \$230 fine under the *Liquor Control and Licensing Act*.
- Nelson's waterfront has three distinct zones for dogs - restricted, leashed and unleashed. Where applicable dogs must be leashed or owner can face a fine of \$150. (See map below)
- Failing to clean up after your dog is a \$100 fine.
- City parks cannot be used for camping. The City Campground will be opening on May 1st and staff would be happy to take your reservation at (250) 352-7618.
