OPERATIONS

UTILITY UPDATE:

From an operations, maintenance, as well as capital works perspective, the utilities are performing well. Some highlights of the work completed include:

- The water main replacement program is in the midst of another successful season, having laid approximately eight blocks of water main so far during this construction season.
- Throughout the downtown core, the fire hydrants are sporting a fresh coat of red paint and most hydrants have received a full service.
- To improve water quality, all blow-offs on dead-end lines were serviced and retrofitted to a matching standard for quick and efficient service.

TRANSIT UPDATE:

The New Chahko Mika Mall Bus Stop is Now Open!!

The stop has been relocated back to the east end of the Mall with new routing behind the Mall which is safer for both transit drivers and passengers.

HYDRO RATE COMPARISON

Average Residential One Month Bill



With a good portion of energy coming from our local hydro generation facility, Nelson enjoys one of the lowest electricity rates in Canada. Below is a comparison of rates across Canada for a 1,000 kWh of residential consumption in 2016. Because rate structures vary from place to place (e.g. block rates in some locations and flat rates like Nelson has in others) the comparison cannot be scaled to other levels of consumption. The average Nelson customer uses 890 kWh per month.

Wildfire Prevention Preparedness

Nelson Fire & Rescue is currently working in partnership with RDCK Area E, Area F, and BC Parks on an updated Community Wildfire Protection Plan and Wildfire Management Plan. Uncontrolled wildfire knows no jurisdictional boundaries, so it is important that all agencies work together in a coordinated manner. Two open house sessions seeking public input on Wildfire Protection planning took place on August 17th and 18th. Nelson Fire & Rescue continues to welcome public input on wildfire prevention and preparedness.

While the Community Wildfire Protection plans looks at prevention on a landscape level, the single most important factor in preventing a devastating wildfire loss occurs much closer to home.
